<u>Sandyland District Policy 5</u> <u>Teacher Officer Policy</u>

(Process is defined in Constitution as below)

Membership on the Board of Directors (Teacher officers) has followed a rotation basis; however, this may be done only with the general consent of all Agriscience teachers present.

Section A. The Secretary-Treasurer shall serve a one-year term and rotate to the Vice President position.

Section B. The Vice President shall serve a one-year term and rotate to the President position.

<u>Section C. The President shall serve a one-year term and rotate off the Board of Directors.</u>

Section D. Elections shall be held during the Agricultural Science Teachers Professional

In order to be up for Teacher Officer Nomination, teachers must have taught a minimum of 3 years as an ANFR teacher and 2 years in the Sandyland District.

Election of District Leadership Coordinator

District Leadership Coordinator position will be voted upon and elected n every TWO years.

<u>District Leadership Coordinator is responsible for overseeing the District officer team and will be present at ALC, CLC, District Planning meetings, Fall District Meeting and Spring Convention and help the officer team in preparing for these events throughout the year with assistance from The Presiding and First Vice District Officers Advisors.</u>

Sandyland District will pay for current district officers to attend ALC

<u>Sandyland District Policy 7</u> <u>District & Area Officer Election Policy</u>

Procedure for electing District officers will be as follows:

- 1. No chapter can run more than 2 candidates for a district office.
- 2. On the first vote, each voting delegate will cast 10 votes for the district officer team. The top 10 candidates with a combined score of application, test, interview, and vote will be the district officer team. In the event of a tie to fill the remaining officer position, we will have a run off between those two candidates in the tie.
- 3. On the second vote, the delegates will vote for 2 candidates for their choice for president. The top 4 candidates with a combined score of application, test, interview, and vote will be in the run-off for district president. *Each candidate will give a one minute run off speech*. After the run off speech, the delegates will vote for 1 candidate for district president. The candidate with the highest combined score of application, test, interview, and vote will be the district president and the candidate with the next highest combined score of test, interview, and vote will be the district 1st Vice President.
- 4. District officer candidates will take a online test made from Senior FFA Quiz materials, turn in District officer Application, and complete a interview the day of district officer elections The Quiz will count 30%, Application 10%, Interview 20%, and popular vote will count 40%

Election Summary –

1st vote − 10 candidates for district officers chosen from the total combined score of application test, interview, and vote. —Top 4 highest scores after vote 1 will give a 1 minute run-off speech.

 2^{nd} vote – vote for 2 candidates. – This will determine President & First Vice

Speech time- Speeches are limited to 2:30 minutes
